Dear Parents/Carers.

It is with great pleasure that I present to you the Governors Annual Report at Johnstown Primary School. The school, in partnership with parents, continues to maintain high standards and a highly consistent approach to teaching and learning across the school. This is achieved by setting high expectations and creating a purposeful learning environment for all of the pupils in the school.

I would like to thank the Head teacher Mr McComas and since his recent absence Mrs Laura Reynolds, Deputy Head Teacher and the Senior Leadership Team on working together effectively for the benefit of all the pupils. I am grateful for the support of the Governing Body, members of 'The Friends of Johnstown' and all parents/carers who work collaboratively to support the school in a variety of different ways. This as I have noted before supports the community spirit of which the school is very proud. Finally, and most importantly, I would like again to pay tribute to the children for their valued contribution, positive attitude and determination to 'Be all they can be'.

During this year the school has done a huge amount of work to embed the Curriculum for Wales 2022. This has constituted a step change in education for Wales. Schools have to develop their own Curriculum using the "Four Purposes" as the starting point. Since its introduction last year this has been a substantial amount of work for all the staff to ensure the school fully incorporates the new guidance. The introduction of the new additional learning needs system highlighted last year has seen further ongoing work to strengthen existing support systems in place for the Health and Wellbeing of pupils and staff. This includes working with an adapted curriculum to support the needs of pupils with wellbeing systems in place to support the needs of staff.

The school governing body is no longer required to hold an annual parents meeting. Instead, the School Standards and Organisation (Wales) Act 2013 now enables parents of registered pupils at the school to request up to three meetings per year with the governing body. In January 2023 the Minister for Education and Welsh Language laid the Education (School Day and School Year) (Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2023. The Regulations increase the number of INSET days from 5 to 6 days for the next 3 academic years (2022 to 2023, 2023 to 2024 and 2024 to 2025).

Curriculum and Organisation of Education & Teaching Methods at the School

Pupils are taught by a qualified teacher in fifteen classes. All classes from Nursery to Year 2 have at least one teaching assistant to support individuals or groups within each class. All classes from Years 3-6 have at least one teaching assistant within each class. This includes supporting pupils with additional learning needs.

In each class, pupils are taught a curriculum based on Curriculum for Wales 2022, using a range of suitable teaching approaches.

Pupils with additional learning needs may require additional support. This is given in the classroom, including small group and targeted intervention support. Additional support is provided in line with the ALN Reform guidelines.

PPA (Planning/Preparation/Assessment) cover for teachers is carried out by qualified teaching staff. One of the teachers is a music specialist who provides cover by delivering the Music Curriculum to pupils from Nursery to Year 6. This teacher also supports the school choir and extra-curricular music activities. The second teacher specialises in Outdoor Learning and delivers this aspect of the curriculum from Year 1 to Year 6.

Language Category of the School

Johnstown Primary School is an English medium school, however, pupils are taught to develop their Welsh bilingual skills in every year group. This is based on the WESP categorisation.

Toilet Facilities

Toilet facilities at the school are in good order and cleaned to a high standard on a daily basis.

Healthy Eating & Drinking

Healthy eating and drinking by pupils of the school is promoted regularly through:

- Healthy School status
- Discouragement of fizzy drinks, crisps and chocolate in lunchboxes
- Fruit eaten during break times brought in from home
- Healthy eating is part of the Health and Well-being curriculum
- Trip letters encourage healthy lunch boxes
- Three water fountains around the school for pupils
- · Aspects of cooking being taught across the curriculum

School Development Plan

School Development Plan priorities for 2023-2026 are:

To engage the whole school community in the Health and Well-Being self-evaluation process and improvement planning.
 To design and implement an effective assessment tracker aligned with the principles of progression.
 Poverty Proofing the school day by reducing the financial barriers faced by pupils from low-income backgrounds.
 To improve the higher order reading skills in PS2 and PS3 via reading for pleasure strategies.
 To refine mathematical reasoning approaches across the school.
